#### RSE Information Evening - Thursday 6th March at 6.00pm

At Ashlands, the teaching of Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) is an important aspect of our pupils' PSHE education. On Thursday 6th March we will be holding a Parents' RSE Information Evening for all parents/carers to give you the opportunity to listen to how we teach RSE at Ashlands. This will take place in the school hall at 6pm.

Statutory guidance states puberty should be covered in Health Education and should be addressed before onset so, as far as possible, pupils are prepared in advance for changes they will experience. At Ashlands, we currently start teaching about puberty in Year 4. In addition to your child's class teacher delivering a series of lessons in the Growing and Changing unit, we invite a specialist educator from Coram Education to deliver a specially designed workshop covering puberty, being safe and human reproduction (human reproduction is in Year 6 only). As part of the RSE Information Evening, Juliet Vo (our local specialist educator) will be able to explain in more detail what we teach during these sessions and the reasons for doing so. She will also be able to show you some of the resources we use to deliver these lessons.

We are well aware that the primary role in children's Relationship and Sex Education lies with parents and carers. By holding this information evening, we want to ensure that you have the opportunity to have a true understanding of how your child's RSE is taught during their time at Ashlands and to give you the chance to ask any questions should you wish to do so.

We would appreciate a rough idea of numbers of those who wish to attend, so we would be grateful if you could complete the Google Form below, ideally by 28th February. Places are limited to two people per family.

#### Nursery and Reception Children.
