<p>Practise the Year3/4 statutory word lists, using games we have learnt in school.</p> <p>might</p>	<p>Practise the times tables. Children could hone their skills using Times Table Rockstars (make sure you're updated to the latest version).</p>	<p>Create an advice leaflet explaining what people should do when a nearby volcano erupts.</p>	<p>Encourage your child to read regularly at home. Support them with their reading by asking questions about what they have read. Encourage your child to read their library books at home too (and return them every Friday, so they can take out another book).</p>	<p>Play a magnetic fishing game:</p> <p>Tie one end of some string to a magnet and other end to a stick – creating a fishing rod. Now cut out fish or sea creature shapes from coloured paper or cardboard and decorate them with markers, stickers, or googly eyes to make them fun and colourful. Attach a small paper clip to each fish or sea creature. This will be the "catch" for the magnetic fishing rod.</p>
