<u>Spelling:</u> Practise the Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 statutory word lists, using games that we have learnt in school.	<u>Timetables:</u> You could help your child at home by allowing them to play on TT rockstars. This will help them with the fluency of their timetables. 'Hit the button' is also another online activity on the Topmarks website. Prodigy Maths	<u>Writing:</u> Non-fiction: The Vikings believed in many Gods, such as Odin, Thor and Loki. Choose one of the Gods and create a fact file including a picture, name, who they were, what they were God of and how they were worshiped by the Vikings. Poetry: Create an acrostic poem using the word VIKINGS.	<u>Reading:</u> Encourage your child to read regularly at home. Support them with their reading by asking questions about what they have read.	<u>Science</u> Living Things and Their Habitats - make a 3D habitat for a mammal, amphibian, insect or bird. 	<u>Computing:</u> You could help your child to develop their touch-typing skills by enjoying BBC dance mat typing BBC Bitesize
