

Here are some ideas if you wish to carry out a mini-project on an aspect of this...

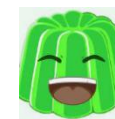
Monitor rainfall in your Garden with a Garden Rain Gauge
