Consider how people lived 100 years ago. Think about your ways to have fun. Think about jobs around the house that you could do without electricity.</p> <p><u>Newspaper report:</u></p> <p>Write a newspaper report about a significant event during WW2.</p>	<p>Encourage your child to read regularly at home. Support them with their reading by asking questions about what they have read.</p> <p>Can you find some poetry linked to World War 2?</p> <p><u>Book Recommendations</u></p> <p>When The Sky Falls - Phil Earle Valley of Lost Secrets - Lesley Parr Letters From The Lighthouse - Emma Carroll Carrie's War - Nina Bawden</p>	<p>Research a famous scientist who created an important electrical invention - present your findings.</p> <p>Invent your own electrical item that has not been invented yet. Explain how it works.</p> <p>Make your own switch to put in an electrical circuit.</p>
<p><u>Some other activities linked to WW2:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Visit the library and find some books on WW2. Make a model of an air raid shelter. You could include objects that could be in your emergency pack in case of an air-raid. Research and write a fact-file on Anne Frank. Glenn Miller was a popular jazz composer in the 1940's. Find out about some of his pieces and listen to them and other pieces of music from WW2. Songs during the War (primaryhomeworkhelp.co.uk) Research rationing and write a menu using those ingredients. Bake or cook a war-time recipe Research ANY key events/information linked to WW2: on children, women, life on the Home front, propaganda, key events in the war. <div>   </div>
