

Autumn 2: Learning opportunities: Travellers and Settlers

Here are a variety of **OPTIONAL** activities which you may wish to do with your child out of school to support and extend their learning in school.

This page is designed to help families to 'Enjoy Learning Together at Home'. However, if your child would like to share any of these tasks with us, we'd be delighted to see their work.

<p><u>Spelling:</u></p> <p>Practise your spellings using your spelling grid, make a spelling poster or game with your words. You could make 'rainbow' spellings using felt tips or chalk your words outside on a path or wall.</p>	<p><u>Maths:</u></p> <p>Read the time in both analogue and digital time. Use time when baking, travelling or when out and about to guide your activities. Look at the hour, minutes and seconds.</p> 	<p><u>Writing:</u></p> <p>Imagine you are a brave young traveller about to embark on a magical journey to the Enchanted Forest, a place full of wonders and mysteries. Your task is to write a short story about your adventure.</p> 	<p><u>Reading:</u></p> <p>Encourage your child to read regularly at home. Support them with their reading by asking questions about what they have read.</p> <p>For example:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Would you make the same choice? Why? • How would that make you feel? • Can you find a phrase that tells us the character is excited? 	<p><u>Science:</u></p> <p>Keep a food diary for a day and think about a balanced diet. Are you eating foods from each food group?</p> <p>Find out how muscles work. Make a poster to show activities which are good for muscle health and strength.</p>

<p>Art</p> <p>Draw or paint a picture of the Taj Mahal.</p> 	<p>Outdoors</p> <p>Design an Ilkley scavenger hunt for your friends to complete with their parents. Children could search Ilkley to find a list of objects. For example: a stone from the Cow & Calf or a leaf from Riverside Gardens.</p>  	<p>Geography</p> <p>What do explorers need to take on their adventures?</p> <p>Think of a location in the world you could explore. Can you think of all the things you would need in your backpack? You can write a list or draw pictures and label them.</p>
